VOLUNTEER SOUGHT TO REVIEW THE ACCOUNTS OF CLEEVE PLAYING FIELDS

Our playing fields in Cleeve are not owned by the Council but are run by a registered charity run by Cleeve-based volunteer trustees, chaired by Colin Warren. As a registered charity, we must file our accounts annually with the Charity Commission. The accounts are prepared by our Treasurer, an experienced accountant, and it is a Charity Commission requirement that these accounts are independently reviewed (checked against supporting paperwork) before filing.

We are looking for a volunteer to perform these independent reviews - the reviewer needs to have an understanding of accounting, but does not necessarily need not to be a qualified accountant. We estimate that the total effort required is around two days a year. TIPS FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

Mulch winter flowering heathers with ericaceous compost (which has a low pH). After flowering, trim the dead heads off to keep the plants compact.

Prune side shoots on grape vines back to five leaves on non fruiting laterals and two buds beyond flower clusters.

Sweet corn can be sown in cell trays inside but delay planting out until next month. Plant basil in pots or in the borders between your tomatoes. It always does better inside.

TIPS FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

Pot indoor plants into bigger pots but check that they need it first! Gently knock the plant out of the pot and, if the roots are covering most of the compost, the plant will benefit from moving into a pot one or two sizes bigger. If they aren't yet then wait a while.

Plant main crop potatoes. Early varieties may need earthing up to exclude the light from the tubers. Cover shoots with fleece to protect from frost damage.

Plant outdoor grape vines in well drained soils in full sun. A pH of around 6.5 -7 is preferred.

SPRINGTIME IN NORTH SOMERSET.

One thing I notice more than anything while travelling around the beautiful area we live in is colour. As we are seeing the end of winter, the grass in the fields has started to change from the dull greens and vellows of the last few months to a vibrant green. It's a sign nature is coming out of hibernation and we can look forward to some warmer weather. As winter ends with mornings getting lighter earlier and evenings drawing out so spring flowers start to appear. The white of snowdrops in January are followed by, crocus, daffodils and primroses in February and March and can be seen along many of our roadside verges. If you get a chance to explore our local woodlands no doubt you will find bluebells. This is an ancient woodland flower that forms a carpet of blue in late spring. A carpet that should be admired and not walked on! Whilst these flowers make a fantastic view, they also provide much needed food for insects. Later flowers such as dog violet, cow parsley, and daisies provide a fantastic source of food for pollinators. These flowers are found widely across British farmland. In some cases, the farmer has planted them but, in the majority, the farmer has just looked after them to make sure they are there and flower year after year. Areas of fields that aren't very productive are often left uncultivated. Nature doesn't take long to self-seed and develop and before long there is a small area of pollen and nectar producing plants which bees and butterflies thrive on. There are aspects of local flower life shared with few other areas. The distinctive vellow flowers of gorse can be seen in various places on the Mendips and if you have the chance to walk through it you will be enveloped by the smell of coconut. Whilst gorse can be found in many places around the UK the same can't be said about the Cheddar Pink. The Cheddar Pink is a rare and protected flower found in Cheddar Gorge and the immediately surrounding area. Some can be found on a rocky outcrop on farmland just past the top of the Gorge. They are out of reach of the cattle which graze the rough grassland surrounding the outcrop so are defended by nature. Every year in June they become a vision of pink with a series of five petalled flowers clumped together on a couple of limestone steps. We are very lucky living where we do. There is so much to see and the flowers of our farm and woodlands are just a part of it.

Keep a few corners wild and somewhat untidy. This will be preferred by wildlife to tidy and intensively cultivated areas.

It's not too late to hang up bird nesting boxes. We have a great range.

Remove winter protection from tender and exotic plants like bananas and tree ferns.

MODERN DAY SLAVERY

On 18 February Cleeve Mothers Union had a quest speaker, Alastair Redfern, Chair of the Clewer Initiative (the Church of England's response to modern slavery). Alastair spoke about modern day slavery and the dreadful impact this has on vulnerable people. So many of the world's problems fuel this dreadful trade; conflict, poverty, migration, famine, social upheaval. Criminal gangs prey on vulnerable people, sometimes bringing them illegally into the country, retaining their passports and forcing them to work for no wages and often in shocking conditions. Modern day slavery is amongst the highest earning activities for criminal gangs, organised by complex, international networks making it hard for the police to find the key people. And yet it is lies not far beneath the surface particularly where low paid, transient work is involved: car washes, agency cleaners, seasonal workers, prostitution, care workers, cheap clothes from overseas that have been produced by exploited workers. Alastair mentioned awful stories of how gangs in this country identify vulnerable people, for example outside food banks, and how they begin to exert control over them. He encouraged us all to open our eyes to these things, become more aware and care for those around us.

NORTH SOMERSET ARTS WEEK MAY 3RD – MAY 11TH 2025

There are several venues in and around Cleeve at this year's Arts Week. Claire Hall will be exhibiting at her studio in Chelvey Batch. Brockley Hall and Cleeve nursery are showcasing the work of 5 artists with paintings, enamels and glass among others. Holy Trinity Church will be the temporary home to 12 artists showing paintings, prints, textiles, jewellery, printmaking and various other disciplines. The North Somerset Embroidery and Textile Group is joining in with a 2-day exhibition at Cleeve Village Hall and will be offering a canvaswork workshop on both afternoons. Paul and Renate will be opening their home as usual, where they will be joined by a mixed media artist.

And there will be three venues in Claverham – St. Barnabas Church, where you will find jewellery, wire sculptures and 'The Feather Lady', plus another 7 artists in the Barn Gallery at the Meeting House and the Meeting House itself, where visitors can admire paintings, ceramics, mixed media and mosaics.

TIPS FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

Cut the old flowers off Mahonias. If you cut a little of the stem too then it may encourage more branching. Varieties that regularly produce the lovely blue berries such as M. aquifolium should not be pruned.

Trim your lawn edges as this simple task has a remarkable effect on the overall impact of your garden. If the edges have become irregular, use a half moon edging iron (stainless steel ones are best) to sharpen them up.

TIP FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

Feed citrus plants with a higher nitrogen liquid feed.

PLANT OF THE MONTH BEAUTIFUL BLUEBELLS

Hyacinthoides non-scripta, or the common bluebell, is one of the UK's most cherished, iconic wild flowers to grace ancient woodland.

April sees local woods and hedgerows carpeted with breathtaking blue hues that cover areas in vast swathes. As well as enthralling us, bluebells are tremendously beneficial to wildlife from bees and butterflies to even hoverflies who crave their nectar.

These beautiful deep violet-blue flowers emit a sweet scent that epitomises spring. Seek out your nearest bluebell wood but tread carefully, their succulent leaves damage easily.

It is illegal to dig up bluebells in the UK, they are protected under the Wildlife and Countryside Act of 1981 so get down to your local garden centre and grab some flowering bulbs to pot up or plant out and bring a little bit of woodland to your garden.

The vigorous Spanish bluebell, *Hyacinthoides hispanica*, was introduced as a garden plant in the 17th century but has caused problems through cross pollination creating a hybrid bluebell so although Spanish bluebells are not banned or on the UK's invasive plant list be cautious not to grow them near native bluebells. Spanish bluebells are easy to identify as they are lighter in colour, larger and stand tall and upright without the desirable, dainty droop of English bluebells.

Steeped in folklore, bluebells are linked with fairies and witches; ring one of the bells to summon a fairy but mind out, you might find one sheltering in a flower from the rain! Bluebells do traditionally have an association with bad luck but I prefer to focus on the positive aspect of this gorgeous flower as a symbol of everlasting love.
