





**Car Park at Goblin Combe:** We are delighted to report that we have secured £5,000 by way of a grant from the Bristol Airport Environmental Fund in order to improve the Goblin Combe Car park by:-

## ON OUR FARMS - APRIL 2023

Everything in farming follows a cycle. Some are short, some are long but nonetheless they all follow their own respective cycle. One of the more visible at the moment is the sheep cycle. After a five month pregnancy, female sheep (ewes) give birth. The number of lambs each ewe has depends to a degree on what breed they are. Upland sheep often only have one lamb each whereas lowland sheep generally have two. That said, it isn't unknown for lowland sheep to have triplets which means some bottle feeding for someone. Sheep are poly mon-oestrous which means they can only breed at a certain time of year. This is why lambs are only born between January and April. Lambs are quick learners. Only minutes after being born they struggle to their feet and make their way to their mother's teat to get a drink. For the next week or so they never stray far from their mum's side but once out in the field with other lambs it is a different story. Gone are the days of lambs tottering alongside mum. Hello being grown up and freedom! There's no better sight that gangs of baby lambs charging around a field only to be called back every now and then by their mums to make sure they are ok.

Another farming cycle is hedge management. Before the introduction of mechanical hedge trimmers, a winter job for farm workers was to trim and lay the farm hedges. Hedges were trimmed annually and every ten years or so laid. Laying a hedge involves clearing the brambles and weedy growth out, cutting part way through the remaining plants and laying them on top of each other at an angle of about 35 degrees to the ground. By cutting only part way through, the plants can be bent into position and they stay alive. They are all laid in the same direction and should always point uphill.

Stakes are driven into the ground at regular intervals to hold the newly laid hedge in place. The newly laid hedge maintains a stock proof barrier, is great for the environment, provides food for wildlife and is valuable habitat for insects, birds and mammals. Whilst fewer farmers lay hedges on a regular basis, there are people who lay hedges for a living and keep the skill alive through instruction and competition. The Wrington and Burrington Hedging Society staged its annual hedging match recently. It was a showcase of a traditional skill that almost died out in the late 20th century. Whilst it is not a common skill among many modern farmers we are lucky there are some who want to preserve an ancient craft we can all appreciate.

## PLANT OF THE MONTH - MAGNOLIA

Magnolia offer graceful beauty with their wistful coloured blooms and architectural branches. They can be large shrubs or ornamental trees, and depending on the species flower in spring and summer sometimes giving a second flush. Although hardy they can succumb to frost so plant in a sheltered sunny spot to give them the best chance.

They can be evergreen or deciduous and are believed to be one of the earliest flowering plants existing 95 million years ago. Sharing similar characteristics to water lilies, they evolved even before bees so were pollinated by beetles and developed tough tepals to cope with the heavier insect traffic, although these days Magnolia are enjoyed by all pollinators.

This diverse genus grows in all shapes, sizes and many colours. *Magnolia x soulangeana* is a popular species with its large goblet-shaped flowers or try the deep purples of *Magnolia liliflora*. The giant of the family is *Magnolia grandiflora*; its highly scented flowers reach 30cm wide and height around 10m but in its native American environment can reach the dizzy heights of 20m tall.

In contrast *Magnolia stellata* is a small tree growing up to 2.5m tall that makes a great focal feature in a large border with incredible star-like white or pink flowers. As magnolia only flower for a relatively short period of the year why not grow a clematis through the branches to elongate the flowering season or even a climbing rose?

## RAVEN 'OUSE IN GOBLIN COMBE

We are lucky in Cleeve to have ravens in residence all year round.

They are easy to spot if you listen out for their calls – which are unmistakable once you know them. The most common one is a deep, hollow croak. Sometimes the call is almost bell-like. They can fly very high, and that's what make them easy to spot once you've heard their call. Our local ravens also like to hang out in the big cedar tree in Meeting House Lane.

They are very sociable birds, often seen in pairs throughout the year. They typically lay three to five eggs. Once the young have fledged, the youngsters often stay as a gang throughout the winter and into Spring. Many youngsters don't make it though the winter.

Our local ravens nest on one of the cliffs in Goblin Combe. They build a deep nest of stout twigs, then line it with sheep wool and other soft items. Sometimes they use baler twine, which is not a great choice as the chicks can get their legs caught in it.

So are ravens actually ravenous? No, not at all. The two words come from different origins – one has old Germanic origins; the other mediaeval French.

## TIPS FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

Sow perpetual spinach, leeks, radish, turnips, lettuces, carrots, beetroot, Swiss chard and summer cauliflowers outside. We have lots of these as ready-to-plant young plants too.

Protect flowers on peaches, nectarines and apricots from frost. Use a soft brush to hand pollinate blooms and increase chances of a good crop.

Don't stop feeding birds now that spring is here, now they have young they are under greatest pressure and will really benefit from your help.

Compost heaps are great places for slow worms and occasionally grass snakes. Both are harmless and are gardener's friends as they eat many plant pests.
