## Cleeve Quarry Car Park, Cleeve Hill Road. Risk Assessment Introduction

In 1855, known as Burnt House Quarry, it was divided into two parts, the west, known as 'Old Quarry', and the east as 'Parish Quarry'. '19th century documentation details a parcel of common land on Cleeve Hill for public stone and gravel pits to be used by the surveyors of the highways for making, amending and repairing within the parishes of Yatton and Kenn. Since the early 1920s, the 'Old Quarry' had been used as a swimming pool, however, its use was discontinued c. 1925. On 1st June 1968 the land renamed as Cleeve Quarry was registered as common land. After a hearing in 1972, there was no evidence of ownership and Cleeve Parish Council were named protectors.

Cleeve Parish Council firmly adopts the strategy within 'Managing Safety in the Countryside Principles and Practice' when considering its approach to land use and access. It is not practical, or even possible, to provide visitors with risk-free environments. We must do all that is reasonably practicable to create a safe environment. A safe environment can be defined as one where the level of risk is broadly acceptable to both the visitor and society at large.

Usually, Under the *Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000 (CRoW)* you have no statutory right to vehicular access on common land, however Cleeve Parish Council as it's protectors give visitors permission to use the gravelled upper section of quarry as a car park.

Subsequently section 68 of *CRoW* shall cease to have effect on the section of common land being used for car parking.
